


What is the Emerald Ash Borer?

The emerald ash borer (EAB) is an exotic insect responsible for the death or decline of tens of millions of ash trees in more than 20 states and Canada. Native to Asia, the beetle most likely arrived in the U.S. in the 1990s, hidden in wood-packing materials commonly used for shipping. The first detection occurred in southeastern Michigan in 2002. EAB already has cost communities billions of dollars to treat, remove and replace ash trees. Infestations are difficult to detect, as the larvae reside under the bark, the adults generally are only present from May through September, and ash trees may be infested for up to four years before there are visible signs of decline.



Potential Impacts in Colorado

In Colorado, EAB was detected for the first time in September 2013 in the City of Boulder. As a non-native insect, EAB has no native predators to keep populations in check, and threatens all true ash species. As a result, the beetle poses a serious threat to Colorado's urban forests, where ash trees comprise an estimated 15 to 20 percent of all trees; the Denver Metro area alone has an estimated 1.45 million ash trees. Green and white ash, including 'Autumn Purple' ash and other varieties, have been widely planted in Colorado due to their fast growth, ability to tolerate urban growing conditions and high aesthetic value. Many of the state's ash trees are located on private property and in parks and other community areas.

Edgewater currently has three-hundred forty-seven documented Ash trees in public right of way and private front yard areas. In order to properly plan for the treatment of all Ash trees, the City of Edgewater has developed a plan to take proactive measures in sustaining the species throughout the City. This plan is based on a coordinated sharing of knowledge and experiences from those communities along the great lakes that were first attacked, scientists, federal and state regulators, along with municipal arborists and green industry members.

Street Sweeping Program

The City of Edgewater regularly sweeps streets the second full week of each month April - November. Each street is swept within Edgewater one day each month based on the schedule below. **New for 2015** the City of Edgewater will be asking residents to move their vehicles at least once during the season (April - November) to sweep the entire curblin of each street. Before each scheduled sweep day the City of Edgewater will post no-parking signs along one side of a street within a zone. Please move vehicles out of this area during the posted time so city crews can get sweeping equipment into the curblin. Please be advised that sweeping operations are not intended to pick up materials raked or brushed off properties. Please rake or brush up yard materials and dispose of them in your trash containers.
