The City of Edgewater has partnered with Xpress Bill Pay, to provide a new online bill pay option that will save you time and gives you more flexibility in how you pay your utility bill. If you have an internet connection and an email address, you can now pay your utility bill online. It's fast and easy, and you no longer have to write a check each month or find a stamp when it's time to send in your payment.

When you sign up for online bill payment you get a unique password that you use to access your personal account at www.xpressbillpay.com. Every month you will receive a reminder email to let you know when your bill is online. Then, just log in through your web browser and view your bill, which will look like the paper statement you're familiar with. Select a payment type- credit card, debit card or electronic funds transfer- enter the information, and you're done.

This service is being offered at the request of customers like you. Sign up today and see why so many people consider this the best way to pay their bills.

- It's FREE to sign up for online bill payment at www.xpressbillpay.com.
- You can pay your bills with a credit or debit card, or you can transfer funds directly from your checking account.

- You can view a year's history of your account online, so you can compare your current bill to a year ago.
- If you'd like you can select the Auto Pay option and your bill will be paid automatically each month.

P OTHOLES

S NOW P LOWING P OLICY

Once again it is that time of year when we must turn our thoughts to snow storms. The City's Public Works Department will put forth every effort to control ice and snow which will provide a safe transportation system at a minimum of inconvenience for all in Edgewater. The only roadways that are plowed are the Avenues, Pierce and Harlan Streets. Please be reminded we do not plow the north-south streets unless there is an emergency. Through past experience, we have found that our citizens do not appreciate snow being plowed into parking areas that have just been dug out and that there are simply too many cars parked on the side streets. This method assures that all residents are within a maximum of (100) yards from a plowed street.

C LEARING S IDEWALKS

It is not only the law to keep sidewalks clear and free of snow and ice, but also a safe practice for your neighbors. Build up of snow and ice can cause injuries to neighbors and visitors walking in the neighborhoods. Please make sure to clear your sidewalks after each and every snow storm.

C HECK F OR L EAKS

It is advisable that you check all your faucets and toilets on a regular basis and repair all leaks immediately. When you check your meter, make sure all the water in your house is off. This could alert you to a broken or faulty meter. A meter that is visibly registering usage when water is off, usually indicates a leak.

S TORM S EWERS

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) requires operators of Municipal Separate Storm Systems (MS4) to develop and implement a Storm Water Prevention Program to minimize the contaminants into surface waters. The Separate Storm Sewer is a system of underground pipes and surface drainage that carry rainwater and snowmelt away from roads and parking lots. Ultimately this drainage reaches our lakes and rivers.

Common pollutants include the following:

- Automotive fluids that leak from our vehicles onto roads, parking lots and driveways;
- Pesticides used to keep lawns green;
- Sediments from construction sites;
- Household trash and chemicals not properly disposed of; and
- Animal waste.

Residents of Edgewater can have an enormous impact on the quality of rivers, lakes and streams by:

- Keeping vehicles maintained;
- Closely following application rates for pesticides and fertilizers;
- Properly disposing of household wastes and recyclables; and
- Unusual discharges from storm drainage swales and piping during dry weather conditions.

CRIME ALERT

In the recent weeks, several residents of Edgewater have reported to the Police Department that they have received unsolicited telephone calls from individuals who are identifying themselves as either "criminal investigators" or representatives of the Internal Revenue Service. Many, although not all, of the residents receiving these telephone calls are senior citizens.

The residents receiving these telephone calls are being threatened with arrest warrants for a variety of offenses, including violations of the Internal Revenue Service Code and fines for unpaid back taxes, unless they call back a contact telephone number to speak with an "investigator." The "investigator" will then attempt to either obtain personal information to facilitate identity theft or demand that the resident send money to a location. These are fraudulent, scam telephone calls. Neither law enforcement nor the Internal Revenue Service contact individuals by telephone to advise them of an imminent arrest warrant or demand that money be sent to a location.

Do not accept these types of telephone calls. Do not provide the individual making the telephone call with any personal identifying information. Do not send money to any location in response to a demand. If you have any question regarding the legitimacy of such a telephone call, contact your local police agency.

The Internal Revenue Service is aware of this scam and is responding with an investigation. It is a scam that is large in scope and probably generated from within a foreign nation, which makes it difficult to investigate and/or prosecute, particularly for a local police agency.
